

Specialty/Subspecialty Pediatric Coverage Summary

December 2015

1. Pediatric Neurology:
 - a. EEG Interpretation: Charlie Braun (IHA Neurology) will be reading pediatric EEG's. Brian Woodruff will cover for him while he is on vacation.
 - b. Pediatric Neurology Consults: Brian Woodruff is available for consults on Tuesday's and Thursday's.
2. Pediatric Radiology:
 - a. Fluoroscopic Studies: Will be performed only by Kim Garver. 2-RADS is the number to call through which someone will let you know if she is available (they will have her vacation schedule).
 - b. To electronically send a copy of a study to UM, contact 2-RADs and they will process that request.
 - c. Pediatric MRI for appendicitis (non-sedated) will be available starting September 1, 2015. The availability will be M-F (8a-4p) after radiologist consult 712-RADS. All patients will receive an US first. Children with US findings c/w non-perforated appendicitis will require no further imaging. Children with equivocal or negative findings (appendix not seen but no secondary signs of appendicitis) with high clinical suspicion may require additional MRI imaging. The study will require that the child be cooperative enough to hold still for 20-30 minutes without sedation.
3. Pediatric Surgery:
 - a. UM is contracted to be available for consults as needed with response time negotiated by the referral source and the Pediatric Surgery provider who is on call. The consult must be completed in 24 hours and sooner if requested by the primary service. Availability by beeper within 30 minutes of page.
 - b. SJMH General Surgery guidelines for pediatric patients has a cut off of 15 years old.
4. Adult Medicine Specialty Consults:
 - a. The adult medicine specialists will see pediatric patients 16 years old and over.
5. Ophthalmology:
 - a. UM contract covers ROP exams and other consults when they are here once a week for the NICU ROP exams. They are not contracted to come in on other days.
6. Pediatric Urology:
 - a. Eduardo Kleer: Will see pts with:
 - i. Foreskin or circumcision issues any age (he doesn't do the GOMCO clamp neonatal circs but can do them any age after a year old)
 - ii. Meatal stenosis issues
 - iii. Undescended testicles (he will see them any age to diagnose and is comfortable operating on the distal canal ones). The undescended testicles in the internal ring or more proximal ones he would refer to UM.
 - iv. Urinary incontinence or enuresis issues after 5 yo
 - v. Renal Calculi 14yo and older (only Dr Kleer will see, not his partners). If intervention is needed he would refer the patient to UM where they have necessary instrumentation

- vi. He prefers UM referral for hypospadias, reflux, recurrent UTIs, urinary tract calculi under 14 yo, pediatric varicoceles and hydroceles.
- vii. He is always happy to answer phone calls about pediatric urology issues to help guide any management questions.

7. Dermatology:

- a. SJMH Academic Dermatology Clinic is in the Reichert Building with daily office hours. They are available to do pediatric consults 7 days per week.

8. Cardiology:

- a. UM Pediatric Cardiology will perform ECHO's on inpatients at SJMH. Dr. Crowley is also available to conduct inpatient consults. He has an outpatient clinic at Michigan Heart.
- b. Michigan Heart Outpatient guidelines:

Office Visits

1. General Cardiology

- Patients ages 16 years and older can be seen by any Michigan Heart general cardiologist

2. Electrophysiology (EP)

- Patients ages 16 years and older can be seen by any Michigan Heart EP provider
- Drs. Shinn & Zishiri will see patients for EP reasons only at ages 14 years and older

3. Vascular Cardiology

- Patients ages 16 years and older

4. Congenital Diagnosis (from birth)

- Dr Dodds will see patients ages 16 years and older.

5. Advanced Practice Providers

- Patients ages 18 years and older

Cardiac Testing

1. EKG's: No age limit on EKG's (pediatric EKG's are read by U of M)

2. Echocardiogram: Minimum age is 5 years old. Must be scheduled with a pediatric trained Echo Tech. Drs Dodds & McCallister read echos ages 5 to 15 years old.

3. Stress Test: Minimum age is 16 years old

4. Holter/EVR: Minimum age is 14 years old

Invasive and EP Procedures

Ages 16 and older with the exception of patients 14 years and older for the following procedures: PFO/ASD closure and EP

Anyone younger than the above ages needs to be referred to University of Michigan 734-936-7418 or Detroit Children's Hospital 313-745-5481.

9. ENT:

- a. The SJMH ENT surgeons are comfortable with just about all pediatric issues including periorbital cellulitis, obstructive sleep apnea, neck abscesses, thyroglossal duct cysts, tympanoplasty procedures as well as tympanostomy tubes/ tonsillectomies and adenoidectomies.

Cases that they would prefer to be sent to UM would include advanced airway issues or airway/esophageal foreign bodies.

10. Allergy/Asthma:

- a. Allergy and Immunology Associates will see inpatient consults for allergy and asthma patients. They do not perform bronchoscopies or read newborn sleep studies.

11. Infectious Disease:

- a. The IHA Infectious Disease Consultants group follows the hospital's guidelines to evaluate and treat anyone 16 years or older in the hospital and in their office. Other than acute STD's, where teens would be better served by rapid testing and treatment by the patient's primary care physician or the Health Department, there are no specific conditions that they would not be able to treat in the older pediatric age group.

12. Endocrinology:

- a. Ann Arbor Endocrinology and Diabetes Associates will treat any patients 16 years and older (inpatient consults and outpatient office) for any diagnosis except for short stature or delayed puberty. They feel that those groups of patients are better served by Peds Endo at UM.

13. GI:

- a. Huron Gastroenterology will see:
 - i. Patients 17 years and older in their office without limitations based on diagnosis.
 - ii. Inpatients 15 years and older admitted to trauma (not 15 year olds on other services) including endoscopy if related to the trauma admission.
 - iii. Inpatient consults on 16-17 year old patients outside of the trauma service, but will not perform endoscopic procedures on 16 year old not admitted to trauma.
 - iv. Will see office "follow-up" on 16 year olds if needed as a post-hospitalization bridge to their being seen at pediatric gastroenterology at UMMC or elsewhere.
 - v. There are no parameters specific to pediatric diagnoses outside the age parameters noted above.

14. OB/Gyn:

- a. IHA: The following providers within IHA enjoy seeing adolescent patients
 - i. Rima Makhiawala : Base office is IHA Livingston OB/GYN. She will also have regular office hours at Chelsea Pediatrics
 - ii. Katie Zdrada and Melissa Goedel at IHA Ann Arbor OB/GYN Domino's Farms

For IHA Gyn surgical cases: 16 yo or over for abdominal surgery such as an ovarian cyst or ectopic. They have also cared for younger patients for vaginal foreign bodies or straddle injuries. Anyone for surgery for congenital anomalies of the reproductive tract should go over to U of M for evaluation.

15. Orthopedic Surgery:

Per Mike Chrissos: The only things that would NOT be able to be treated at SJMH are : Scoliosis (though Doug Geiger does see some patients), Congenital Hip (though Don Wild does see these patients), Distal humerus/supracondylar fractures, Pelvis pain, Abnormal Gait.

- a. IHA Community Orthopedics
 - i. All finger, hand and wrist problems on pediatric patients of any age.
 - ii. Call office for (712-0647 for daytime. Web exchange after hours or weekends):
 - iii. Pediatric infections and significant congenital deformities
 - iv. Patients that have forearm and elbow injuries, or patients that need same day care.
- b. Ann Arbor Orthopedic Surgery (Chrissos, Denzin, Masini, Moravek, O'Keefe, Schultz, Schueller)
 - I. Masini, O'Keefe, Schultz – arthritic hips, knees – no kids.
 - II. Schueller – back, general Ortho – will see kids.
 - III. Chrissos – shoulder, knee, just about all fractures – will see kids.
 - IV. Moravek – upper extremity, general Ortho – will see kids.
 - V. Denzin – hip, knee arthritis – will see kids.
 - VI. Telfer – general Ortho – will see kids but not fractures.
- c. Orthopedic Surgery Associates (Aalderink, Borden, Janda, Kelley, Moore, Wild, Young)
 - i. Age 10 years or older
 - ii. Spine, scfe, tumors, Perthes, Blounts to UM
 - iii. Dr. Don Wild sees club foot and DDH

16. Plastic Surgery:

- a. Center for Plastic and reconstructive Surgery
 - i. Breast deformity
 - ii. Gynecomastia
 - iii. Cleft Lip
 - iv. Cleft Palate

- v. Nevi (including giant nevi)
- vi. Rhinoplasty
- vii. Otoplasty and ear deformities
- viii. Extra digits (Hand)
